

Two Years Given Young Mother in Forged Check Case

An attractive young mother, Mrs. Jean Geraldine Munroe, 29, Tuesday pleaded guilty to forgery and was given two years in prison by Criminal Dist. Judge Henry King.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Clarence Bentley said the forged check, for \$64, was passed to an Oak Cliff grocery in October, 1951.

Mrs. Munroe's time will be served concurrently with a two-year sentence given her in Beaumont after a jury trial in another forgery case. Bentley said her husband, Thomas Monty Munroe, was serving a six-year sentence for forgery in Louisiana.
