

Constables To Convene Here Friday

The constables of Texas will gather 500 strong at Hotel Jefferson during the week end for a convention and school in law enforcement problems.

Constables Kal Segrist and Robie Love said Thursday that the school on handling hot-check writers under the new Texas law would be open to merchants and other interested businessmen. Sheriff Bill Decker will conduct it at 10 a.m. Saturday with the help of Jack Mumford of the Dallas offices of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Asst. Dist. Atty. Clarence Bentley.

Segrist is president of the Constables Association of Texas and Love is board chairman.

Visitors will register at the hotel Friday and attend a party at 7 p.m.
