

Ex-Felon Gets Prison Term On Check Rap

Victor Fabio Freyre, 29, the ex-convict who tried to escape police last fall by hiding in a ladies' room and answering queries in a falsetto voice, Friday was given two years in prison.

Freyre pleaded guilty before Criminal Dist. Judge Harold B. Wright to passing a worthless \$250 check last June 16.

Asst. Dist. Atty. Clarence Bentley said Freyre's two-year state term will be served concurrently with a like term given him in federal court this week.

Earlier this week, Freyre drew a two-year federal sentence here for transporting a stolen car across state lines.

His arrest last October ranked among the zaniest in Dallas police history.

Officers saw him walk into a West Davis Street tavern, and decided to question him. Freyre saw them coming, ran into the ladies' room and shut the door. But the policemen pushed in after him, having checked first with the proprietor to be sure no women were inside.

When they opened the door, they found Freyre had drawn a cloth curtain hanging just inside the door. A falsetto voice pleaded from behind the curtain, "Oh, please don't come in here." Ignoring this plea, they brought Freyre out at gunpoint.
