# **Expert to Talk On Problems Sputniks Pose**

What can America do about the Sputniks and their deadly ally, the intercontinental ballistic missile?

Dallas will hear its first in-person answer to this question at a 7:30 p.m. Tuesday meeting, sponsored by the Dallas Squadron of the Air Force Association and Southern Methodist University, in SMU's Karcher Auditorium.

Peter J. Schenk of Santa Barbara, Calif., and a planner of the American air defense system as military projects manager for General Electric Company, will answer the question.

A film tracing the 50-year history of the Air Force in war and peace also will be shown.

Schenk, president of the Air Force Association will come to Dallas fresh from having predicted that America's missiles will not be sufficiently operational for war use for another four years.

In a talk to the AFA's board of directors at Colorado Springs, Colo., over the weekend, Schenk also declared that Russia is considerably ahead of the United States in regards to guided missiles, but, like the United States, is not yet ready to use its missiles in combat.

Schenk also will speak to Dallas business and civic leaders at a Dallas Airpower Council meeting at noon Tuesday in the City Club.
