





### KOREAN ISSUE IS CLARIFIED BY GOLD STAR

Emphasis on the fact that Gold Star Mothers membership is open to mothers of Korean war casualties as well as the two world wars was placed today by Gwen Veghte, president of the San Fernando Valley Chapter, in announcing that the local branch has always had its roster open to them. In fact the Valley chapter just last week issued a special news release inviting Korean gold star mothers to affiliate. Whether or not gold star pins may be awarded mothers of the Korean dead, however, depends on the fate of a bill now pending in Congress, according to Mrs. Walter H. Boyd of Long Beach, national president of the organization. Mrs. Boyd said she had received numerous calls since two women of Tucson, Ariz., told of being informed by a Marine officer that only mothers of World War II dead were eligible.
