Missile 'Briefing' Slated For Dallas Businessmen

Invitations have gone into the council president, and Carr Collins Jr., council secretary and businessmen to attend a missile briefing by industrial scientists from the area.

Officers of the Air Power Council, which will sponsor the briefing, plan to send out another 750 invitations Monday.

First of its kind to be held anywhere, the 2-hour briefing by hand knowledge of all kinds of leading "brains" of Chance missiles.
