

Southlanders Killed When Plane Crashes

The president of an El Segundo electronic and missile component firm and his advertising manager were killed Thursday night in the crash of a light plane on an Arizona fishing resort airstrip.

James E. Dillon, 45, of 11 W Wideloop Road, Rolling Hills, president of Darco Industries, Inc., and David Mosbacher, 42, of 351 Palos Verdes Blvd., were trapped in the flaming wreckage of a four-place Cessna.

According to Mohave County Sheriff Frank Porter, Dillon, piloting his own plane, attempted to land after dark during a rainstorm guided by automobile lights shining on the runway.

Dillon was an officer in the corporation operating the resort on the Arizona shore of Havasu Lake on the Colorado River.
