

Texas Manufacturers Plan Dallas Meeting

The Texas Manufacturers Association will hold its 37th annual conference Jan. 14-15 in the Sheraton-Dallas Hotel.

This year's conference has been planned to give Texas business and industrial leaders a look at important issues facing business in 1960.

The conference will open with sessions devoted to the current labor law picture.

Speakers for this part of the program include Phillip Landrum, congressman from Georgia; Leroy Jeffers, Houston labor law attorney; Joe Jenkins, member of the National Labor Relations Board, and John J. Gilhooley, assistant secretary for the Department of Labor.
