

U.S. Chemical Acquires Texas Plant Site

Acquisition by United States Chemical Milling Corp. of a 20-acre plant site near Dallas, Tex., was announced yesterday.

President C. H. Lundquist stated the acquisition was made "in order to provide for future expansion in the rapidly growing industrial areas of the Southwest." The property is located midway between Ft. Worth and Dallas in Tide Industrial Park.

The company also revealed plans for the establishment of facilities in the New York-Philadelphia-Baltimore area and in the Midwest.

"These additional manufacturing facilities will be established as needed to meet the steadily rising volume of business," he said.

He added the backlog of orders continues to increase and is now in excess of \$2,500,000.

Fluor to Work on New Nuclear Problem

The Fluor Corp., Ltd., has been awarded a government contract to study the use of nuclear energy in salt water distillation processes, it was reported yesterday. Fluor will analyze, theoretically, the economics and technical feasibilities of using nuclear energy either directly as a source of heat, or indirectly as electrical power, in distillation processes.
